

### **COMMUNION DIRECTIONS**

All baptized Christians are invited to receive the sacrament of the Eucharist. During communion, please come forward at the direction of the ushers to the stations at the Chancel steps, or, if unable to do so, to request that communion be brought to you in your pew. Our custom in the Episcopal Church is to receive both elements by putting hands forward, palms crossed and facing upward to receive the bread, and by guiding the chalice lightly to receive the wine. If you would like to receive a blessing instead, go to the stations and simply cross your arms across your chest.
